University of South Australia,
7 - 30 October, 2015

Slave making absorbs men, women and children into servile work and bondage. Cases of slavery have been found in Australia. This exhibition illustrates how Australia is exposed to modern slavery through our international supply chains and through slave-making in our own country. It includes 11 posters and slide shows to illustrate how slavery operates, how it can penetrate Australian supply chains and what legal protections are available in Australia. An information kiosk encourages visitors to explore some of the Treaties which operate in the region. These Treaties offer legal protection for domestic workers, child workers and people subject to forced labour.
